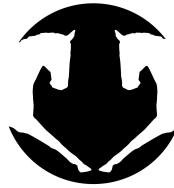

Riders do NOT need any memberships to participate in this competition. All riders are welcome, from all regions. This show is registered as part of the [USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards](#) program. In order to participate in the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards, riders must have a USDF GMO membership and pay the nominating fee through USDF. This is NOT required to participate in this show.

Levels: USDF Introductory through FEI as well as Western Dressage. All current editions of tests will be used. Leadline tests, Prix Caprilli, and Introductory Musical Freestyle tests posted at the end of the prize list.

Riders:

FEI Age rules apply. Riders are considered whatever age they will be on Dec. 31, 2022. Riders may **NOT** turn 22 this year, unless riding in the Collegiate division (riders must be incoming or current students of the school they are representing, and may not have graduated).

A rider may NOT ride the same horse in two different divisions (except if a rider wishes to show in a Western Dressage division and a Classical Dressage Division).

Horses:

1. A horse may be ridden by 2 different riders in the same or different divisions. A horse may compete in a maximum of 3 tests total per day (excluding DSE & leadline). Every effort will be made to provide sufficient time between rides for riders sharing mounts.
2. Horses must have a **current Coggins test** (blood draw date within 12 months of the end of the show) and **proof of Flu/Rhino** (EIA, EHV 1, EHV 4) vaccination dated within the past 6 months. The **HITS Event Participation Declaration** must be provided at check-in. Be aware that horses may need a **Certificate of Veterinary Inspection** to be in compliance with agricultural transportation laws.

Chef d'Equip:

Each team should have a designated adult Chef d'Equip to act as the team captain. The Chef should submit all entry forms, required health papers for horses, and payment to the show secretary. The Chef will be responsible for communication between riders and show management regarding special needs or changes.

Entries:

Entries must be mailed or emailed to the show secretary by the Chef prior to the closing date.

Checks should be made payable to LVDA Youth Challenge. Paypal info will be listed on the entry form. It is preferable that one payment be sent for the whole team. Numbers will not be distributed on the show grounds unless all fees have been paid. **Entries will be considered on a first come first serve basis and may be closed early. Late entries will be permitted to fill scratch rides or fill show as space permits.**

Team Divisions & Tests:

Teams will be placed in divisions. Show management reserves the right to combine and/or split divisions depending upon entries. Teams may be organized to represent a GMO, farm, trainer, club or be a group of individual riders. Each rider/mount combination will ride the two tests designated for their division and may only compete in one division. Each rider should anticipate that one test in the team division will be ridden on Saturday and one test in the team division will be ridden on Sunday. A rider may ride a different mount in the same or a different division. A team may be 3 or 4 riders. Any individual or partial team may request to join a mixed team and show management will attempt to form teams. Leadline is not eligible to join a team.

Individual Classes:

Riders are welcome to ride additional tests. Warm-up tests will be scheduled before team rides each day, and will be split into classes by show management. Please think about your horse's well-being considering age, fitness and possibility of heat and humidity. Horses may not be ridden in more than 3 classes total per day (Leadline & DSE do not count against class limit).

Changes:

After closing date, changes will be made at the discretion of show management only and will incur a \$25 fee. Refunds before closing date minus a \$20 office fee. No refunds after closing date.

Ride Times:

Ride times will be emailed to Chefs and posted on the website and Facebook event page at least 1 week prior to the start of the show.

Awards:

- Individual class ribbons 1st-6th places for all classes.
- Team medals for riders and team neck sashes for horses for 1st-6th places
- High Score and Reserve High Score ribbon by level (Intro, Training, First, 2nd & Up, Western Intro, Basic, Level 1 & Up)
- DSE - 1st - 6th place ribbons for Saturday qualifying classes. Horse neck sashes and rider medals for 1st -6th places for Sunday Championships. DSE Championship to include a mounted awards ceremony with honor lap.
- Leadline - 1st through 6th class ribbons. 1st through 6th neck ribbons, with placings to be determined by highest single test score.

Team Awards Ceremonies:

Sunday award ceremonies will be mounted with an optional honor lap. Riders may have a groundsperson if needed or appear unmounted. Riders may wear team attire, costumes, or show attire for awards. Attendance is not mandatory, however, an additional fee will be necessary for ribbons and prizes to be mailed. A tentative schedule of awards ceremonies will be emailed with ride times.

Dressage Seat Equitation Championships:

Riders who would like to participate in the DSE Championship should sign up for the DSE Qualifying test on Saturday. The Saturday test will be in groups of no more than 6 riders. The top finishing riders on Saturday will be called back on Sunday for the DSE Championship. There is no additional charge to compete in the Sunday class if qualified. *NOTE* Only riders who are not registered to ride in a class that includes cantering may enter the W/T DSE class and the W/T DSE is restricted to riders FEI age 13 & Under.

Stall Decorating Awards:

Teams may choose to decorate their horse and tack stalls. Judging for these awards will take place on Saturday. All decorations must be removed before you leave on Sunday. Safety is a priority, you must avoid fire hazards. Winners will be announced on Sunday.

Stable Management Awards:

Awards will be presented for outstanding stable management. You never know who will be coming through the barn to assess your area for cleanliness, neatness, horse care, etc.

There will be additional contests and prizes awarded throughout the competition.

Apparel:

Riders may wear schooling show or formal show attire. ASTM/SEI approved helmet and proper riding boots (half chaps allowed) are required. Braiding is optional. Horses may not wear boots/wraps in the competition arena.

Volunteering:

We encourage all riders to donate at least one hour of their time during the show. Please check in with the show office to sign up to volunteer during the show. We also welcome sibling and parent volunteers. Individuals 16 and over, please email the show manager if you would like to volunteer during the show as a ring steward, runner, scorer, or other needed position.

Stabling:

Stabling will be in permanent barns with 12'x12' stalls with half doors. Electrical cords must be 12-gauge, 3-wire, negative ground type. No initial bedding will be provided. Bedding may be pre-purchased or you may bring your own. There will be overnight security on grounds Friday and Saturday nights. Each horse MUST have a completed stall card with emergency contact information. Stalls do NOT need to be cleaned before leaving and there is no stall cleaning fee.

Arenas:

There are several competition and warm-up arenas. All are outdoor all-weather sand/bluestone/fiber or sand/bluestone footing. Dressage tests will be ridden in a standard 20 x 60 meter arena. Intro through Training Level Test 2 may take place in a small arena of 20 x 40 meters or a standard size arena depending upon entries. Equitation classes may take place outside of the dressage arena, in an enclosed ring.

Vendors: Vendors are welcome, please reserve with the show manager. Vendor spaces are outdoors, you must bring your own tent or trailer and provide proof of insurance per requirements of the facility.

Rules:

SAFETY FIRST

- ALL RIDERS MUST WEAR HELMETS WHEN MOUNTED. There are absolutely zero exceptions.
- Horses that are entered in the show may only be ridden by their entered riders on Saturday and Sunday.
- Please wear proper footwear around the horses.
- All dogs MUST be LEASHED while on show grounds, including stable areas, and must have a responsible person with them at all times. Dogs may not be left unattended in barns (including being tied in the barn or locked in stalls). Owners may be fined. Dog owners are responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors.
- Absolutely no smoking in barns.
- Bridle numbers must be worn at all times when horses are outside of their stalls.
- Sharps containers are located in the barns. Please dispose of medical waste properly.
- All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents, or their horses.
- Bikes are not permitted in barns.
- Barn aisleways are to be kept clear at all times. Horses should be able to walk through safely.
- Only licensed drivers may operate motorized vehicles on the show grounds, including golf carts, scooters and cars.
- USEF rules will be followed unless otherwise noted.
- All equipment such as whips, spurs, bits, etc. shall be in accordance with USEF rules. Whips are permitted in all classes.
- Readers are permitted in all classes, but memorization of tests is encouraged.
- Please observe all posted showground rules.

Team Rules:

- Each team is required to have 6 scores. The top 6 scores from each team will be counted.
- Eliminated/retired, scratched, or withdrawn rides will count as 25%.
- The total percentages of each team's counted rides will be added together and divided by 6 to determine the team's average score.
- Teams will be placed by the highest average score.
